





George Fernando, a street performer, continues to share his music in the empty square. "I don't play for the money; I play because it makes me happy."




**Shelli** Madrid, New Mexico




## Everything has Changed Madrid, New Mexico











Frontline on the Navajo Nation Arroyo Grande, California

Joe Robinson, an emergency physician based in California, saw a decrease in hospital patients amid the pandemic and went to find temporary work elsewhere. This led him to the frontline of fighting COVID-19 on the Navajo Nation, the most impacted region in the United States. There he worked 12 hours shifts at a time. He explains that 50% of people on the reservation don't have running water, a lot don't have electricity, and that the community lives in close quarters, making them more susceptible to the virus.
